Biographical Note

Clarence Alfred Bunker

C.A. Bunker was born in Roxbury on June 14, 1866 to parents Alfred and Cordelia Mitchell (Barker) Bunker. Bunker graduated from Bryant & Stratton Commercial School in 1880. He then spent time preparing for Harvard at Roxbury Latin School. Bunker graduated from Harvard College in 1889 and then Harvard Law School in 1892. From 1892 – 1898 he worked for the Boston law firm Fish, Richardson, & Storrow. He then went into private practice, opening his own office at 5 Tremont Street, Boston, which he then moved to Barristers Hall in Boston in 1905. He would maintain this same office until the time of his retirement in 1959. C.A. Bunker married Mary Hawthorne White of Wellesley, MA in 1897. The couple built a house at 46 Chestnut Street, in Wellesley Hills, MA the same year. They raised three children, Raymond Thayer Bunker, Laurence Eliot Bunker, and Miriam Hawthorne Bunker and spent the rest of their lives in this house.

In addition to his law career, C.A. Bunker was very active in the Wellesley community. He was director of the Wellesley National Bank in 1904, going on to serve as vice-president and general counsel until 1959. He was also involved with the Boston Five Cent Savings Bank, Wellesley Cooperative Bank, and Lincoln Trust Company. Bunker was also involved in town government, serving on the Board of Selectmen from 1916 – 1934 and as a Town Meeting member until 1959. He was an active member of the Wellesley Hills Unitarian Society and instrumental in the organization of the Boy Scouts in Wellesley, serving for many years as the deputy commissioner

of the Norumbega Council. Bunker was an active traveler, a member of the Wellesley Associates, Maugus Real Estate Trust, Waban Real Estate Trust, the Wellesley Club, and the Wellesley Historical Society. C.A. Bunker died at the age of 95 on August 19, 1961 and is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Wellesley.

Mary Hawthorne White Bunker

Mary Hawthorne White was born on Walnut Street in Wellesley on October 26, 1869 to parents George White and Frances Mary Edwena Noyes White. Mary Bunker graduated from Radcliffe College in 1894 after preparing for college at Newton High School and through tutoring with Wellesley resident, Gamaliel Bradford. She married Clarence A. Bunker in 1897. In addition to raising three children, Mary Bunker was very active in the Wellesley community. She helped organize the first Girl Scout troop and council in Wellesley in 1917. She served many roles on the Girl Scout council in Wellesley as well as serving on the state level of the organization. In 1948 the Girl Scouts honored her service by naming the Wellesley Girl Scout camp, Camp Mary Bunker (located on Lake Cochituate in Natick, Massachusetts). She was a founding member of the Wellesley Historical Society, active in the Wellesley Hills Unitarian Society, Wellesley Hills Woman's Club, and the Radcliffe Alumnae Association. Mary Bunker passed away at the age of 90, on February 8, 1960 and is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Wellesley.

Raymond Thayer Bunker

Raymond T. Bunker was the son of Clarence and Mary Bunker and was born in Wellesley on April 5, 1901. He graduated from Harvard in 1924 and entered into the army having participated in the ROTC while at Harvard. Raymond married Harriet Bates in November 1933, the two had two sons, Robert Monroe Bunker and Roger Eliot Bunker. Raymond served in the South Pacific during World War II and continued to serve in the army after the war until his retirement. When in Wellesley, the family lived at 45 Amherst Street, but spent much of Raymond's army career living in Maryland, Kansas, Florida, Japan, and Connecticut. The couple moved out of Wellesley permanently in 1973, settling in Connecticut. Raymond Bunker died on July 25, 1995.

Laurence Eliot Bunker

Laurence E. Bunker was the son of Clarence and Mary Bunker and was born in Wellesley on June 27, 1902. He attended Wellesley grammar schools before going to Boston Latin School. Laurence Bunker graduated from Harvard in 1926, he then spent four years in England at Trinity College University of Cambridge, earning first his BA in 1928 and then his MA in 1930. Bunker attended law school at the New York Law School, graduating in 1938. He served in the army during World War II as the Aide-de-camp to General Richard Marshall in Australia from 1942 – 1946. From 1946 – 1952 he was Aide-de-camp to General Douglas MacArthur. He returned to Wellesley and practiced law in Boston following his retirement from the army. Laurence Bunker lived his entire life in his childhood home at 46 Chestnut Street. Bunker was a member of many Wellesley organizations including the Wellesley Symphony Orchestra and the Wellesley Historical Society, of which he served as president for ten years. Other memberships included the Bunker Family Association, the Bunker Hill Memorial Association, the General Douglas MacArthur Memorial Foundation, and the John Birch Society. Bunker, like his father and brother, was also very involved in the Wellesley Boy Scouts organization. Laurence Bunker died on October 10, 1977 at the age of 75.

Miriam Hawthorn Bunker

Miriam H. Bunker was the daughter of Clarence and Mary Bunker and was born in Wellesley on June 18, 1904. She attended the Walnut Hill School in Natick, MA and Girls Latin School in Boston before attending Radcliffe College. Bunker graduated from Radcliffe in 1926. Miriam also earned a certificate from Bryant & Stratton Commercial School in 1929. Bunker worked as part of the Social Service Department of Massachusetts General Hospital for 50 years. She began as a volunteer in 1926 and became an official employee in 1930 and retired in 1976. Miriam Bunker was active in the Wellesley Girl Scout organization, the Wellesley Historical Society, and the Wellesley Hills Unitarian Society. She died on February 21, 1993 and is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Wellesley.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains materials related to the life and work of the Bunker family. Materials include genealogical research regarding the Bunker family, as well as related families, including the Billings, Barker, and White families. The collection contains correspondence and photographs belonging to several members of the Bunker family, as well as deeds to properties belonging to the Bunker family or related to C.A. Bunker's work as an attorney. Also included are materials related to the Bunker family's life in Wellesley and their involvement in local organizations such as the Wellesley Hills Lawn Tennis Association.
